



This week, we have been learning to read and spell words containing the suffixes **-ful**, **-less** and **-ly**.

### **-ful and -less**

**-ful** and **-less** can be added to the end of words to make adjectives.

Adjectives with **-ful** mean 'full of'.

Adjectives with **-less** mean 'without'.

**careful**  
**careless**

### **-ly**

An adverb can be made by adding the suffix **-ly** to an adjective.

When the root word ends in **y**, we need to replace the **y** with an **i** before we add the **-ly**.

**happy** → **happily**

We have been learning to spell the common exception words **caught** and **daughter**.
