World Book Day

World Book Day is on Thursday 7th March this year. The day will start with the opportunity to come to Broadway hall from 8am till 8.30 for '**Bridgeway Breakfast with a Book'**, where parents and children can come and have a bacon roll, and share some books together the booking for this event is via Arbor and the cost is £1 each. There are limited spaces so early booking is recommended! Booking will open this evening (Friday 23rd) at 7pm and will close on Tuesday March 5th at 9am.

There will be lots of exciting activities happening throughout the day. The children will be taking part in a joint Broadway and Ridge Book Treasure Hunt where the children will find book and character clues and questions around the school grounds. As usual, we will be sending home a challenge for families to

take part in if they would like to. This year, we will be sending home blank postcards for you to design, decorate and write (these are in children's book bags today). Children can decide to write to a character in a book, write as if they are the character themselves, write about their favourite book – anything they like! We will make a display of all the postcards in school.

Breakfast Club

It is vital that you book your child onto Breakfast club via Arbor at least 16 hours before the session you require. We have had a number of instances where children have arrived to Breakfast club without being booked on. We have a maximum number of children allowed at Breakfast club to adhere to adult/child ratios for safety. We will not be able to breach numbers if you arrive with your child and they haven't been booked onto the session and the session is full. Booking for the whole of Term 4 is open and all parents are able to book via Arbor.

Parking

Parking remains to be a serious issue around the schools. We know it is busy at drop off and pick up times however please **DO NOT** park over residents drive ways or unsafely on corners or blocking pavements.

We have also had some parents who have reported to us that other parents have been very rude to them when parking has been mentioned. Please do show respect to all members of our school community and speak to others how you would want to be spoken to.

As a reminder our advice is to park in the cinema car park and walk the short distance to school—this helps us to keep our whole school community safe.
