Your child can become a Champion Reader if they have read on at least 5 occasions during the week (not multiple reads on one night). When you have heard your child read please write in their reading record to show that you have heard them read and their reading records will be checked in school.

Reading their school reading book, playing games on Phonics Hero (KS1), reading flashcards and practising common exception words can all be counted as a read so please write these in their reading record.

Regular reading practise supports your child's fluency, confidence and therefore enjoyment of reading which is so important during these early years of education and beyond.

Summer Reading Challenge

Well done to all the children who completed the library reading challenge this summer. The children in Y1 and Y2 who have their awards in school with them have been celebrated in assembly. We are asking that Reception children bring their awards in next Friday to be celebrated as that will be their first assembly. If any other children forgot to bring theirs today they can bring them in next Friday.

School Lunches

As you will have seen on our school lunch menu there is a jacket potato option for the children each day. The jacket potatoes need to be ordered so we are only cooking the amount we need to try and reduce food wastage. If you know your child would prefer a jacket potato because they are not keen on the other options **please come in to the office or call by 9am** (please do not email as this might not get picked up in time). You can also let us know in advance of the day it is required. Then the cook will make sure she cooks and keeps a jacket potato for your child.

Facebook

As you will know we have a school Facebook profile which we use to share photos and updates from the classes; including photos of the children who are awarded the good work and star awards each week. Other important school messages and reminders are also shared. Our security settings are set so that you cannot see any information if you are not our 'friend'. Medication

If your child is in Y1 or Y2 and you have previously filled in a health care plan for any medication that is required to be kept in school please can you ensure the medication is returned ASAP.

If your child is in Reception and requires medication to be kept in school please pop in to the office and ask for a care plan to complete and drop off the medication.

**Please note school staff can only give medication that has been prescribed by a Dr. <u>Year 1 - break times</u>

In Y1 children are learning through a continuous provision approach which builds upon the way they learned in Reception. As part of this approach Y1 are not going to be going out onto the main playground for morning break time to ensure their learning is not interrupted through the morning. Children will have the outside area open and all children will be active and learning through play for parts of the morning ensuring that they are getting fresh air and exercise. Children will also have the opportunity to eat their fruit or healthy snack during the morning. The children have responded really well to this change. They still go out to the main playground for their lunchtime play.


During the event children will be sitting in their classes and parents and carers can go and join them. There will be cake and drinks—tea or coffee for the parents and juice for the children.
