Christmas Shows—8th and 11th December

Practising for our Christmas show has begun and the singing is already sounding great! Performance times are 9.30am and 2pm on both 8th and 11th December. Please note if you have a younger child you need to bring along to the show we ask that you book the Monday afternoon performance as all other performances are adult only. Parents will be allowed a maximum of 2 tickets per family at a cost of £1 each. Tickets can be bought via Arbor. The tickets appear in the trip section and booking will open on Monday 20th November at 6pm.

The system will only allow you to purchase 1 ticket per performance therefore we have set up each performance twice. If you would like both your tickets at the same performance you need to book the performance on the same date and time, e.g. 1 and 1a or you can book 1 ticket at two different performances.


