Funding our school - Census Day

On **Thursday 5th October** it is the first Census day of the year. Census day is very important for our school funding because information about the school is taken as a snapshot and Government funding is then based on this data. For example if all 180 pupils were in school on census day we would receive funding for all of the pupils however if only 170 pupils were in school then our pupil funding would drop based on the attendance for that day.

The same is true for school dinners, the Government grant towards your children's free school meals is based on the number of children having school dinner on 5th October. If more children have school dinners over the year than on these census days, there is a shortfall in the amount of money that the school receives. In the past, this has meant our school has had to make up the shortfall from the main school budget costing us thousands of pounds.

Therefore all children will be offered a school lunch on **THURSDAY 5th OCTOBER** so that we can receive the maximum funding possible, which will benefit the school and your children. The dinner menu has been changed so that **fish fingers and chips will now be served.** If you would like to order a jacket potato for your child instead you can do so at the office. If you would like to send a packed lunch for your child then of course you are able to do so.

Parking

Parking and traffic has begun to be a problem again at the beginning and at the end of the school day. Local residents are feeling the strain of the additional traffic that the start of the academic year brings. Please do be considerate to local residents by not parking in front of driveways and turning your ignition off when waiting in your car. Our recommendation is to park in the cinema carpark for drop off and collection times and walk the short distance to school. This considerably reduces that amount of traffic on the Ridge Estate which therefore improves the quality of life for local residents; makes the roads and footpaths safer for the children and also reduces your journey time as you will not be queuing to get onto and off the Ridge Estate during peak travel times. Thank you for your support with this.


During the event children will be sitting in their classes and parents and carers can go and join them. There will be cake and drinks—tea or coffee for the parents and juice for the children.
