
This week, we have been learning to read and spell words containing unspoken 'e'.



Top Tip

The grapheme 'e' is sometimes unspoken at the end of a word. This means that it does not make any sound and does not change the other vowel sounds in the word. This grapheme can be tricky as it often appears like the word contains a split digraph.
