# What is the Early Years Foundation Stage (E.Y.F.S)?

•The E.Y.F.S. is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.

•It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.

### Areas of learning...

<u>PRIME AREAS</u> These are crucial for developing children's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning.

- 1. Personal, Social and Emotional Development including 'self-regulation', 'managing self' and 'building relationships'
- **2. Communication and Language** including 'listening, attention and understanding' and 'speaking'
- 3. Physical Development including 'gross motor' and 'fine motor'

### **SPECIFIC AREAS**

- 4. Literacy
- 5. Mathematics
- 6. Understanding the world
- 7. Expressive arts and design

# Characteristics of learning – The ways in which a child engages with other people and their environment

# Playing and exploring – children investigate and experience things and 'have a go'

- Finding out and exploring
- Playing with what they know
- Being willing to 'have a go'

# Active learning – children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties and enjoy achievements

- Being involved and concentrating
- Keeping trying
- Enjoying achieving what they set out to do

# Creating and thinking critically – children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas and develop strategies for doing things

- Having their own ideas
- Making links
- Choosing ways to do things
