

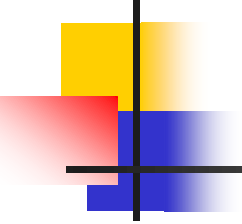

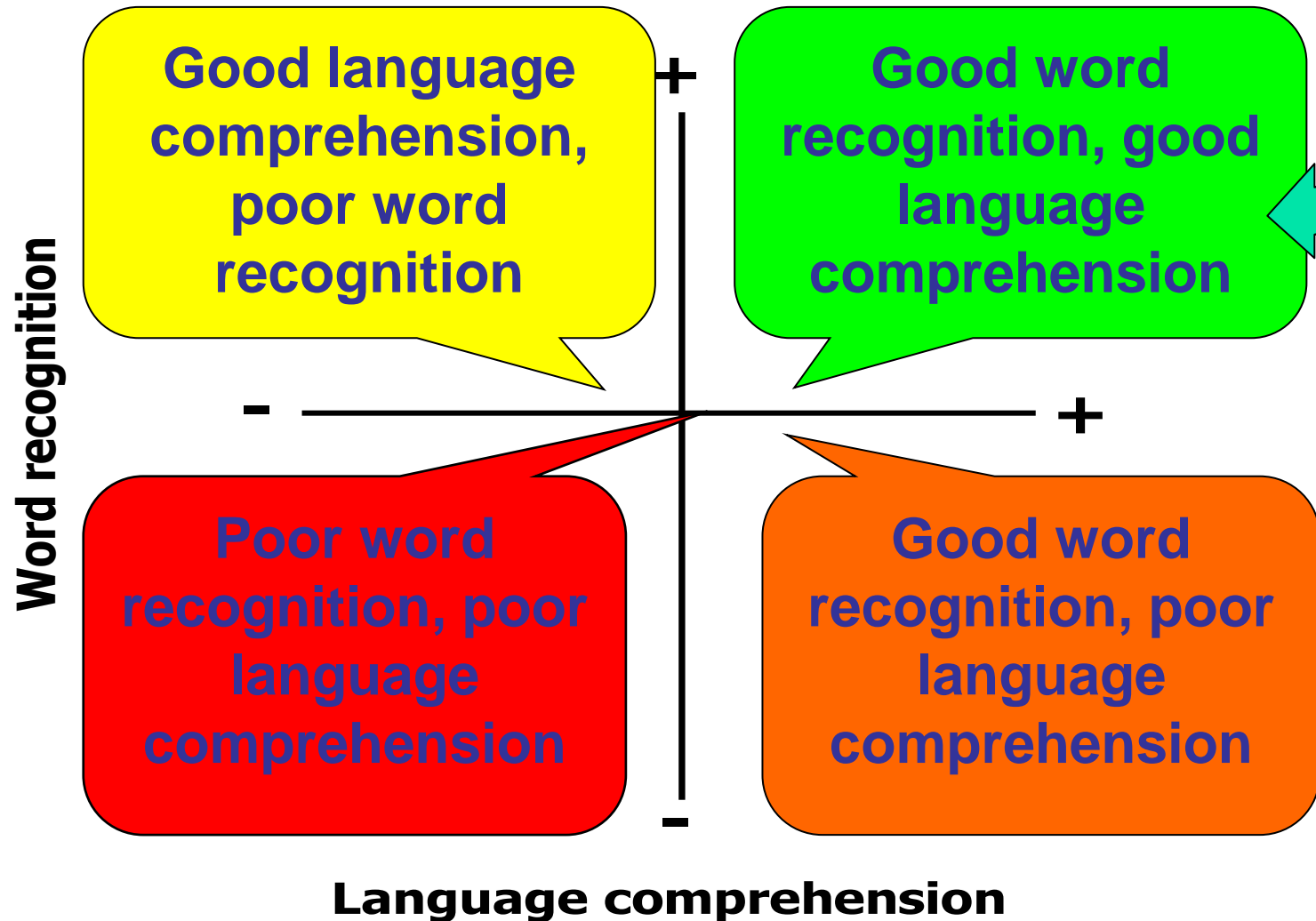
What makes a good reader?


- Children who can:
- use a range of strategies to work out unknown words
- retrieve information from a book
- deduce, infer or interpret information they have read
- identify and comment on the structure and organisation of a piece of writing
- explain and comment on a writer's use of language
- Identify and comment on a writers' purposes, viewpoints and the overall effect
- relate texts to their own social, cultural and historical contexts

How do we teach reading in school?

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- Guided reading
 - Whole class shared reading
 - Focus on phonic skills for blending
 - Focus on comprehension

How can a parent or carer help their child to reading?

- Give your child opportunities to talk to about what they do well when they are reading and talk about what they need to do next
- Asking children questions about the stories or the factual books they have read
- Reading, reading, reading and more reading...
- Letting your child see you reading too
- **Making sure children develop a love of reading**
