Just as we can build our physical muscles by the right kind of exercise, we can also exercise our learning muscles to develop strength and stamina.

At Broadway children are taught the skills they need to become successful life long learners.

Our learning characters visually demonstrate these skills to the children and support them to think about their learning behaviours.

Children are rewarded with a learning character sticker if they are demonstrating the skills linked to one of the characters.

Children's names are recorded on a recognition board to show who has been demonstrating the skills of being a successful learner.

Show **curiosity** and ask questions

Cooperate with others and articulate their thinking

Show **enthusiasm** and embrace the task
